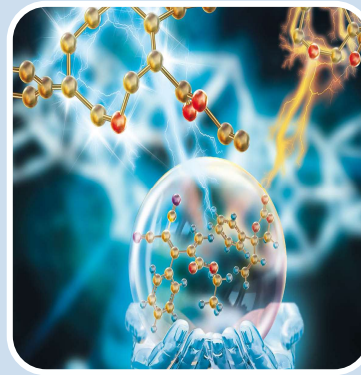

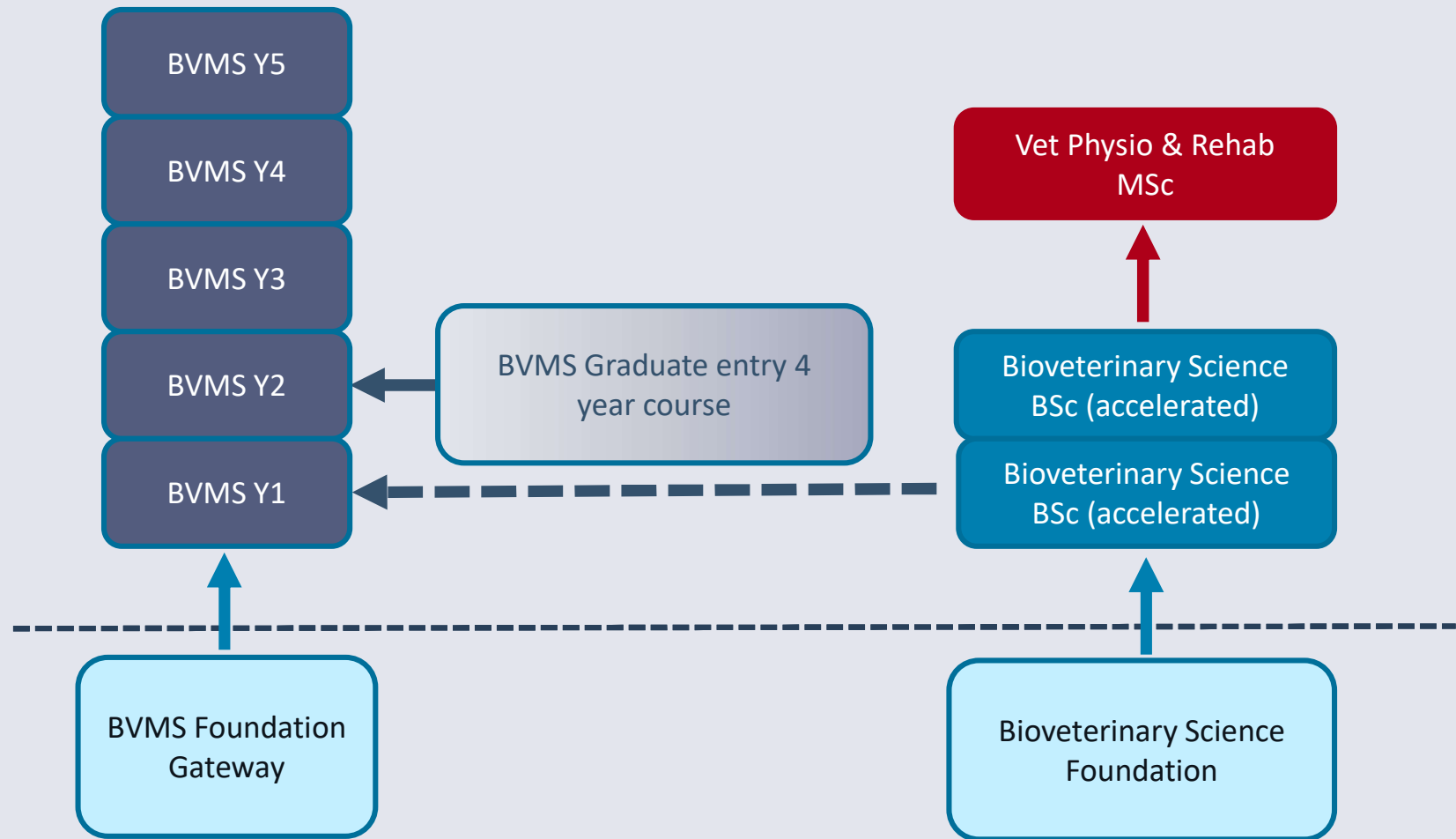

Entry requirements

Veterinary Medicine and Surgery (BVMS)

- AAB (two science subjects, plus one other)
 - or ABB (three science subjects or two science subjects and Maths) at A2 and corresponding equivalents including:
- Pearson BTEC Level 3 National Extended Diploma 1080 glh D*D*D* (specific units)
 - Animal Management or Applied Science
 - Applied Science (all routes) with at least four from the following optional units:
- (BTEC Subsidiary Diploma D*, require 2 further A levels)
- Science T level with relevant occupational specialism D/D*
- Graduates in sciences 2.1 or above

- Personal statement and reference
- Relevant work experience desirable
- MMI on campus



Entry requirements

Foundation Entry Veterinary Medicine and Surgery (BVMS)



- BBB at A2
- DDM BTEC Extended Diploma
- T level merit or above
- Access HE

Transferable skills, non-traditional routes, academic performance, basic sciences.

To progress onto Year One of our BVMS course, you'll need to partake in the standard application process



Entry requirements Bioveterinary Science, BSc (Hons)

Two year accelerated degree aimed at wide range of animal science careers

- 120 UCAS points/BBB including 2 in science subjects
- BTEC Extended Diploma: DMM or BTEC Diploma: D* D* in Science or Animal Management
- Pass Access Course: 120 UCAS points in Science
- International Baccalaureate Diploma: Pass including 120 points from Higher Level Subjects including two Sciences
- T level science at M (appropriate specialisms)

Foundation Entry

- UCAS: 80 points at A2.
- BTEC Extended Diploma: MMP or BTEC Diploma: DM
- Pass Access Course (80 UCAS points)
- T Level: P (C+) without specialisation



Key messages
